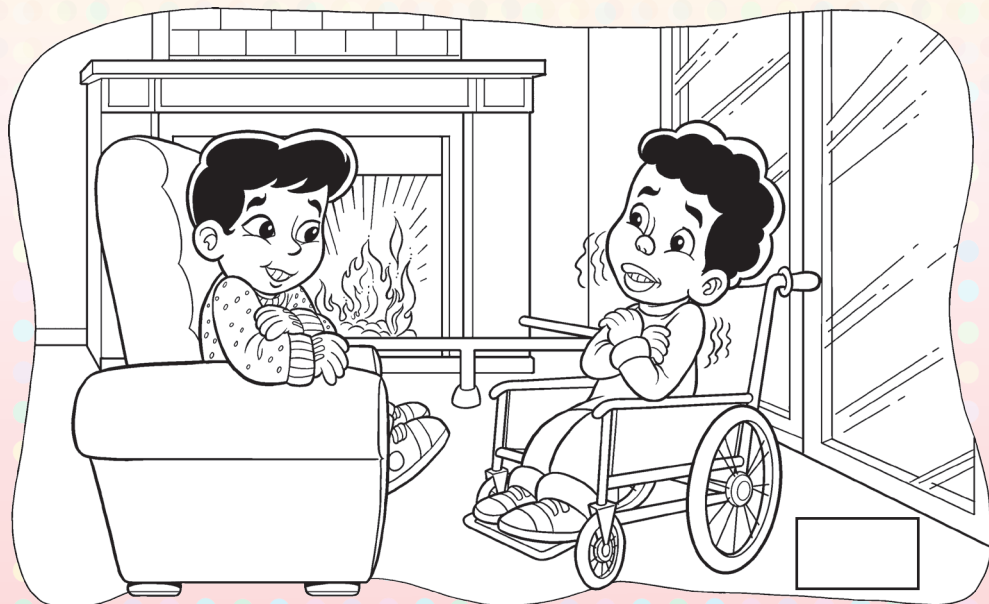
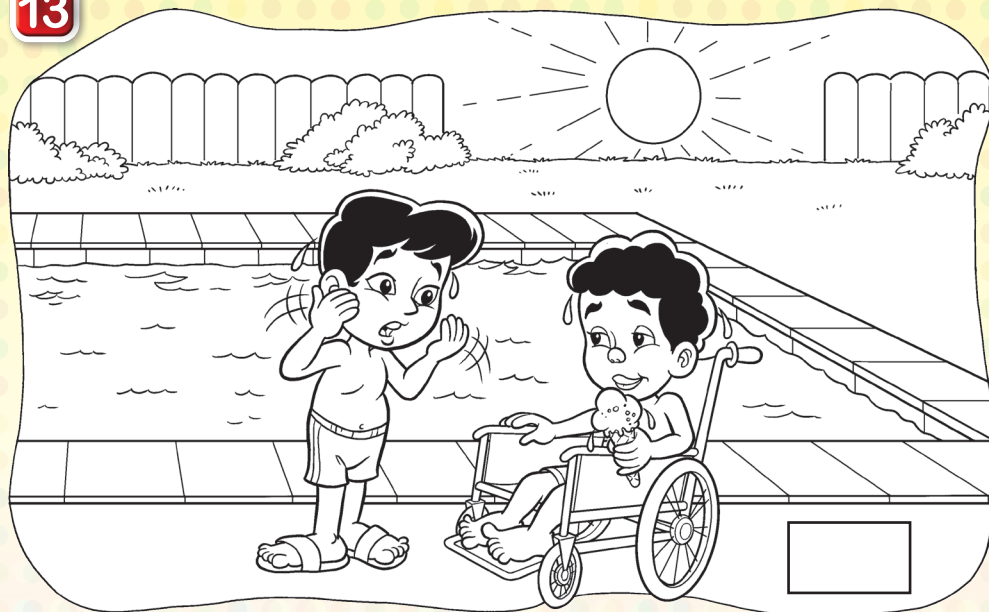
How do we say umbrella in English?
